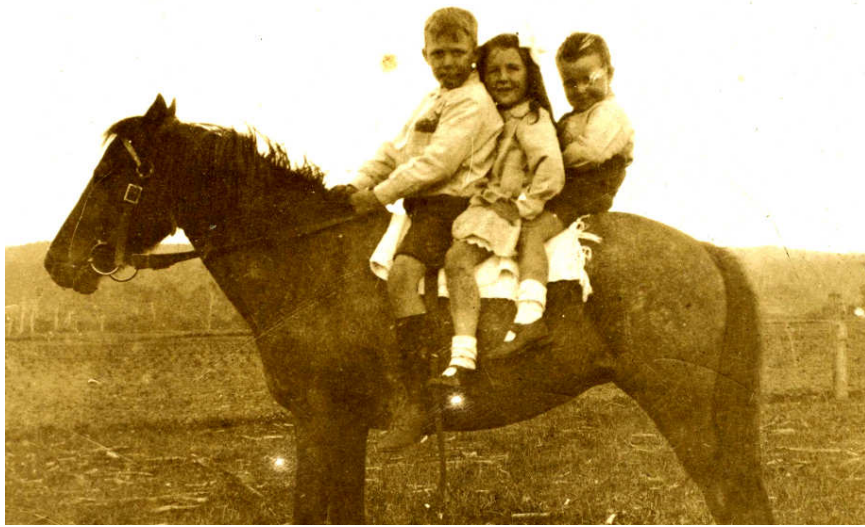

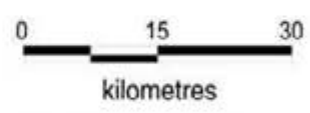

History of settlement and development within the Shire of Avon, including the history of Aboriginal occupation of the area and a description of the lifestyle of the Kurnai.

Account from documents held in the Public Record Office and the National Archives of the family of Lucy and Percy Pepper of Lake Tyers. Percy Pepper was born at Ramahyuck about 1877.

Detailed account of the tribal and social organisation of Aboriginal tribes in south eastern Australia, including the Kurnai of Gippsland.

These journals include a journey through Gippsland in 1844, from Westernport Bay to Port Albert and Twofold Bay. The daily entries describe the land, the Aboriginal tribes and the squatting runs.

Smyth, Robert Brough

The Aborigines of Victoria: with notes relating to the habits of the natives of other parts of Australia and Tasmania

Melbourne: Currey, O'Neil, 1972. 483,456 pages. First published 1876.

Historical record of the state of the Aboriginal people in the second half of the nineteenth century, drawn from primary sources as reports and letters of magistrates, explorers and anthropologists. It deals with the physical characteristics of Aboriginals, their distribution and population, daily life, ceremonies, mythology and language.

Victorian Aborigines 1835-1901: a resource guide to the holdings of the Public Record Office, Victoria

[Melbourne]: Government Information Centre, 1984. 64 pages.

Short history of Aborigines in Victoria since European settlement, illustrated by selections from the documents, letter books and reports held by the Public Record Office. It includes an annotated list of their holdings which relate to Aboriginal matters.

Includes a detailed description of early exploration of Gippsland, consisting mainly of McMillan's and Strzelecki's own accounts of their experiences.

Bride, Thomas Francis

Letters from Victorian pioneers: being a series of papers on the early occupation of the colony, the Aborigines, etc

Melbourne: Trustees of the Public Library, 1898. 325 pages.
